County Property Taxes 2009-10

Property taxes levied in 2009-10 are **reduced by 6.8% or \$729 Million** from 2008—09
 Property taxes levied have reduced by \$13% or **\$1.5 Billion since 2006-2007**

Est. taxable property values: *\$1.5 Trillion, a reduction of 10.86%* or \$184 Billion from 2008-09.

If no millage rates were changed – this would represent a loss to counties of \$1.1 Billion.

Counties with new construction and adjusted millage rates only made up 37% - \$436 M of this loss, leaving more than \$729 million to be absorbed through reduced services.

² During the county budget process a proposed millage rate establishes a maximum millage rate in the final budget hearing. Numbers were calculated solely for comparison purposes as there is no statewide millage rate.



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40 counties increased their millage rate, of those 36 remained below the rollback rate. For Example: Lee County, increased the millage by .0246 yet remains 24% BELOW the rollback rate with \$93 million in decreased revenues - a 22% drop from 2008.

45 counties (67%) will collect less property tax revenue
22 counties (33%) will collect more property tax revenue
