

In 2017, **18** commissioners dedicated **27** hours to graduate from **ACC** program.

204 county commissioners have continued their education by receiving an advanced designation and graduating from the Florida Counties Foundation's **Advanced County Commissioner Program.**



In 2017, **11 county commissioners** completed the **45 hours** of coursework to graduate from the **CCC program**.

Since the inception of the Foundation, **421 county commissioners** have taken courses to enhance their skillset required to excel in their roles as public officials through the **Certified County Commissioner Program.**



To date, **Suwannee County** has the highest number **(14)** of county commissioner that have graduated from the **CCC program**.



Flagler and Nassau have the highest number (8) of ACC graduates since the beginning of the program.


Florida Sheriff's Association Cooperative Purchasing Program


