EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 2020-06 ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, Emergency Order 2020-01 declared a local state of emergency based on the COVID-19 virus on March 16th; and,

WHEREAS, Emergency Order 2020-02, 2020-03 and 2020-04 adopted certain restrictions on restaurants and bars which were established by the Governor's office and were intended to coordinate with the City of Gainesville's Emergency Directives; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to §252.38(5)(a) Florida Statutes, provides that the County has the authority to take whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the public; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor has issued Emergency Order 68-71 closing bars and restaurants to the public for on premises dining and alcohol sales; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor's order has the effect of superseding the orders of the Board of County Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, the Chair of the County Commission is the Official Authority as prescribed in the County's Code §27.07; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to §252.38(1), Florida Statutes provides that the County shall have jurisdictional authority over the entire county.

THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Based upon the Governor's Emergency order 20-71 the Board of County Commissioner withdraws those parts of its previous orders concerning the sale of alcohol and on premises dining.
- 2. Bar and Restaurant owners are encouraged to read the Governor's order to understand what commercial activities are allowed and what are not.
