7 8	WHEREAS, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, Emergency Management governs Local Emergencies;		
9	and		
10	WHEREAS, Lake County ("County") is currently under a State of Emergency pursuant to Executive		
11	Order No. 20-51, as declared by Governor DeSantis on March 1, 2020; and		
12	WHEREAS, Resolution 2020-29, dated March 16, 2020, of the Board of County Commissioners of		
13	Lake County, Florida, declared a local state of emergency in response to the Coronavirus Disease 2019		
14	("COVID-19"); and		
15	WHEREAS, Resolution 2020-30, dated March 23, 2020, of the Board of County Commissioners of		
16	Lake County, Florida, extended the local state of emergency for an additional seven (7) days due to the		
17	ongoing health threat to those within the County related to COVID-19; and		
18	WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-83 to reinforce the		
19	Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") guidelines implemented as part of the "15 Days to Slow		
20	the Spread" initiative; and		
21	WHEREAS, COVID-19 continues to pose an imminent health hazard and an increased risk of		
22	infection to residents of the County and healthcare, first responders, and emergency medical service workers		
23	caring for patients with COVID-19; and		
24	WHEREAS, public health experts have consistently recommended avoiding close physical		
25	interaction between people to slow the spread of COVID-19, and the CDC has updated and further restricted		
26	its distancing guidelines; and		
27	WHEREAS, the CDC has stated that older adults and people of any age with serious underlying		
28	medical conditions are particularly at risk for severe illness or death from COVID-19; and		
29	WHEREAS, the Lake County Board of County Commissioners is committed to supporting local		
30	businesses that follow social distancing practices and that pursue business practices that safely serve		
31	consumers during this public health emergency; and		
32	WHEREAS, the Board also recognizes that recreational activities are a necessary part of maintaining		
33	good health; and		
34	WHEREAS, on March 30, 2020, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners executed		
35	Resolution 2020-33 for purposes of establishing social distancing requirements for businesses that now		
36	requires an amendment to further address certain types of businesses; and		

1	WHEF	REAS, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Lake County, Florida, has
2	determined that	it is necessary to issue this Emergency Order to: protect the health and safety of the residents
3	and visitors of	Lake County, Florida; to assist the healthcare delivery system in its ability to serve those
4	persons infecte	d by COVID-19; to prevent community spread of this deadly disease; and to preserve the
5	public's access	to essential services and maintain the operation of critical infrastructure.
6	NOW'	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners
7	of Lake County	y, Florida, that:
8	Section	1. Minimum Standards for Businesses. All businesses in Lake County may remain
9	open under the	following conditions:
10 11 12		All employees and patrons must practice social distancing by staying at least six (6) feet apart: provided, however, that childcare facilities/homes, service providers (such as hairstylists), shall comply with paragraphs 7 and 8 below in lieu of this provision.
13	· · · · · · · · · · · · · · · · · · ·	Group meetings, including trainings, must be limited to ten (10) people or less, and attendees
14 15	3.	must practice social distancing by staying at least six (6) feet apart. Occupancy shall be limited to 30% of the maximum allowable capacity under the fire code,
16 17 18		for non-residential, non-medical, and non-lodging uses; provided, however, that this requirement will not apply to that childcare facilities/homes, service providers (such as hairstylists), grocery stores, pharmacies or hardware stores shall comply with paragraphs 4, 7
19 20	4.	and 8 below in lieu of the occupancy limitation of this paragraph. Occupancy for grocery stores, pharmacies, or hardware stores shall be limited to a rate that
21 22	5.	allows for the maintenance of at least six (6) feet between patrons and employees. Checkout points and staging areas, including storefronts, must be monitored for social distancing requirements by means of marking floors or similar actions to maintain six (6)
23 24		feet distance between patrons and employees.
25 26	6.	Appropriate signage must be posted throughout each physical location reminding patrons and employees to observe the social distancing requirements.
27 28	<u>7.</u>	Service providers whose primary business require employees to have physical contact with patrons (such as hairstylists) must adhere to standards including but not limited to the
29		following: • There must be a distance separation between personal service stations. For example,
30 31		every other chair in a salon must be left vacant to observe distance requirements.
32		• Patrons should be encouraged to wait in their vehicles until the service provider is
33		ready to provide service directly to that individual. Alternatively, patrons should
34 35		wait outside the facility observing the six (6) feet separation from other patrons. Service providers should then call the patron to notify them to come inside the
36		facility.
37		• Service providers must wash hands or use hand sanitizer between patrons. It is
38		strongly recommended that service providers wear personal protective items such as
39	•	masks.
40		• Patrons who exhibit symptoms consistent with COVID-19 shall not be allowed to
41		receive service at the facility.
42		• Nothing herein prohibits a service provider from instituting any other measures that satisfy the intent of this emergency order.
43	o	Childcare facilities/homes should operate under the following conditions to the extent
44	<u>8.</u>	Children racing should operate under the ronowing conditions to the extent

1	practicable:			
2	Childcare facilities/homes should operate in line with CDC guidelines.			
3	• To limit exposure, child drop off and pickup will be at the entrance only.			
4	• Childcare shall take place in stable groups of ten (10) or fewer people, inclusive o			
5	childcare staff.			
6	• Children and childcare staff shall not change from one group to another unless it i			
7	necessary to provide breaks for childcare staff. Staff must wash hands or use hand			
8	sanitizer when changing groups or returning to a group after a break.			
9	• If more than one group of children is cared for at a childcare facility/home, each			
10	group will be in a separate room, and groups shall not mix or interact with each			
11	other. In order to limit exposure to multiple families, siblings will be kept togethe			
12	when possible in mixed-age classrooms.			
13	• Wellness checks should be performed upon entry into the childcare facility/home			
14 15	and monitored throughout the day. Any child exhibiting symptoms consistent with COVID-19 shall not be allowed to stay in the childcare facility/home.			
16	When possible, all indoor/outdoor play equipment should be used by one group or the should be used by the should be			
17	children at a time and must be cleaned and sanitized before use by another group o			
18	children.			
19	• Nothing herein prohibits a childcare facility/home from instituting any othe			
20	measures that satisfy the intent of this emergency order.			
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24	Section 2. Minimum Standards for Individuals. Social gatherings must be limited to no more			
25	than ten (10) persons and all persons must stay at least six (6) feet away from each other.			
26	Section 3. Boating Restrictions. All boaters using any waterway in Lake County shall comply			
27	with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Executive Order 20-09 which requires the			
28	following:			
29	1. Recreational vessel occupancy is limited to no more than ten (10) persons per vessel.			
30	2. A minimum distance of 50 feet between recreational vessels and any other vessel shall be			
31	maintained; provided, however, this distance does not apply to mooring fields, public o			
32	private marinas, or any other permanent installed wet slips, and does not apply to vessels			
33	underway unless they are tied, rafted or moored to another vessel.			
34				
35	Section 4. Penalties: Applicability. Businesses and individuals that do not comply with this			
36	Order on a consistent basis are subject to monetary fines up to \$500 per occurrence, in accordance with			
37	Section 125.69, Florida Statutes, Section 252.47, Florida Statutes, and Section 252.50, Florida Statutes			
38	Repeat violations could result in the issuance of a mandatory closure order in accordance with Section 252.46			
39	Florida Statutes. This Order is enforceable by an any county or municipal law enforcement official, code			
40	enforcement official, and emergency management official. Nothing herein shall supersede any requirements			
41	or directives issued by Governor DeSantis.			

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1	Section 5.	Effective Date. This Resolution	on shall take effect upon signature and shall remain			
2	effect throughout the Local State of Emergency, unless earlier rescinded.
