RESOLUTION NO. 2020-46 1 2 3 EMERGENCY ORDER PROVIDING GUIDANCE FOR RELIGIOUS SERVICES 4 WHEREAS, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, Emergency Management governs Local Emergencies; 5 6 and 7 WHEREAS, Lake County ("County") is currently under a State of Emergency pursuant to Executive 8 Order No. 20-51, as declared by Governor DeSantis on March 1, 2020; and WHEREAS, Resolution 2020-29, dated March 16, 2020, of the Board of County Commissioners of 9 Lake County, Florida, declared a local state of emergency in response to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 10 11 ("COVID-19"); and 12 WHEREAS, Resolution 2020-30, dated March 23, 2020, of the Board of County Commissioners of 13 Lake County, Florida, extended the local state of emergency for an additional seven (7) days due to the 14 ongoing health threat to those within the County related to COVID-19; and WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-83 to reinforce the 15 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") guidelines implemented as part of the "15 Days to Slow 16 17 the Spread" initiative; and 18 WHEREAS, COVID-19 continues to pose an imminent health hazard and an increased risk of infection to residents of the County and healthcare, first responders, and emergency medical service workers 19 caring for patients with COVID-19; and 20 WHEREAS, public health experts have consistently recommended avoiding close physical 21 interaction between people to slow the spread of COVID-19, and the CDC has updated and further restricted 22 23 its distancing guidelines; and 24 WHEREAS, the CDC has stated that older adults and people of any age with significant underlying medical conditions are particularly at risk for severe illness or death from COVID-19; and 25 WHEREAS, on March 30, 2020, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners executed 26 Resolution 2020-33 for purposes of establishing social distancing requirements for businesses; and 27 WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners executed 28 Resolution 2020-34 and later amended on April 2, 2020, in Resolution 2020-35 for purposes of addressing 29 30 social distancing requirements for service providers and childcare facilities; and WHEREAS, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-91 on April 1, 2020, that orders 31 senior citizens and others with significant underlying medical conditions to stay at home. This Executive 32 33 Order also directed that all persons shall limit their movements and personal interactions to only those 34 necessary to obtain or provide either essential services or essential activities; and
