<ul> <li>Public Health Expenses</li> <li>Expenses for communication and enforcement by State, territorial, local, and Tribal governments of public health orders related to COVID-19.</li> <li>Expenses for acquisition and distribution of medical and protective supplies, including sanitizing products and personal protective equipment, for medical personnel, police officers, social workers, child protection services, and child welfare officers, direct service providers for older adults and individuals with disabilities in community settings, and other public health or safety workers in connection with the COVID-19 public health emergency.</li> <li>Expenses for disinfection of public areas and other facilities, e.g., nursing homes, in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency.</li> <li>Expenses for technical assistance to local authorities or other entities on mitigation of COVID-19-related threats to public health and safety.</li> <li>Expenses for public safety measures undertaken in response to COVID-19.</li> <li>Expenses for quarantining individuals.</li> </ul>	This includes focused monitoring of Nursing Homes, Assisted Living and Adult Day Care Facilities and support for a robust contact tracing program. This will also address unanticipated health-care related expenses needed for the two BARC facilities and Nancy J. Cotterman Center. Hurricane preparation that fosters social distancing, including the renting of hotels and other costs for shelter spacing and staff. The County plan contemplates nearly 1,000 residents for special needs, requiring additional protective measures due to compromised immune systems. Work with the Sheriff and others to acquire and store PPE in preparation for the upcoming flu season, which we anticipate will be indistinguishable from the normal flu; provide funds for substantially higher levels of cleaning and disinfection for over 200 County buildings; and public awareness campaigns. A supported isolation program will provide support for families in need of temporary isolation, including hotel stays, food and other needs to encourage people to not work if they are sick.	\$100 M
