




Joe Theissman is an entrepreneur and the former star quarterback for the Washington Redskins. Since retiring from the NFL, Theismann has become a staple of sports broadcasting.

Theismann played football at the University of Notre Dame, where he received All-American honors for his efforts in leading the Fighting Irish to consecutive Cotton Bowls and was the runner up for the Heisman Trophy. As a pro, in addition to earning a Super Bowl Championship ring with the Washington Redskins, Theismann played in 163 consecutive games from 1974-1985, was a two-time Pro Bowl selection, and was named the NFL's "Most Valuable Player" in 1983.

In addition to his accomplishments on the gridiron, Theismann is an inspiration and a role model, having participated in numerous philanthropic projects. In 1982, Theismann was awarded the NFL's "Man of the Year" title for his efforts in improving his community and his dedication to the health and welfare of children, an inspiring and infectious mindset that he leaves with his audiences.

Drawing from personal experience, Joe knows how to deal with the challenge of change. On November 18, 1985, he was on top of his game--a two-time Pro Bowl player and the most productive quarterback in the history of the Washington Redskins. Later that evening, he found himself in a hospital bed with a compound fracture to his leg, shattering both his career and his boyhood dream. At age 35, he was faced with starting over his personal life and professional career. Joe helps audiences tackle change by keeping a positive mental outlook and committing to a vision that guides you to the top.

ACCESS 67: Expanding Broadband Access in Florida

The ACCESS 67 Initiative of the Florida Association of Counties (FAC) is focused on policy solutions to assist rural and urban communities deliver effective public safety, healthcare, economic development and education. The COVID-19 pandemic further illustrated the digital divide leaving unserved and underserved communities disconnected from distanced learning, remote work, and telehealth opportunities.

The ACCESS 67 panel will offer local, state, and federal perspectives on the challenges of closing the digital divide through public policy. Recent state legislative developments will be discussed highlighting the efforts of the Florida Legislature through the Department of Economic Opportunity's Office of Broadband. Industry and policy leaders will discuss solutions to address the impacts of the lack of ACCESS to critical telecommunication and information technology resources in Florida communities.

Policy topics to be covered include: general/state of access in Florida's counties, Broadband federal recovery funding, local solutions (county initiatives), state legislative/executive/DEO developments, challenges/opportunities of expansion, mapping, and infrastructure.



Making Sense of BlockChain and Cryptocurrency Technology

The growth of Blockchain technology that provides an encrypted platform to transmit value and data across a wide variety of sectors, such as health care, finance, transportation, and many others has captured the attention of both private and public entities. Blockchain use cases continue to expand and grow. One of the use cases most widely known is cryptocurrency or digital currency. Led by Bitcoin, the cryptocurrency industry has exploded with staggering market capitalizations estimated to be over \$1 trillion. Unlike U.S. Treasury currency, digital currencies are decentralized, encrypted and unregulated and there are still limited consumer protections. However, major financial institutions are recognizing that these cryptocurrencies are becoming widely accepted by the public and businesses alike and used for various transactions. Many countries and state and local governments are still trying to find the best approach to regulate or restrict the use of cryptocurrency until more is understood about their risks and benefits. Some local governments are exploring specific applications for the use of cryptocurrency and blockchain use cases in general. This workshop will help explain the history and technology of Blockchain along with one of its most widely used applications - cryptocurrency -so counties can make more informed decisions as these technologies grow.

American Rescue Plan

Join the Executive Director of the National Association of Counties (NACo), Matt Chase, as he gives a comprehensive breakdown on the American Rescue Plan's Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act was signed into law containing approximately \$350 billion in federal assistance for our states, territories, tribes, counties, and municipalities. Of the funds, \$65.1 billion is allocated with direct funding to counties.

Across the nation, counties have been on the frontlines every day fighting against COVID-19 and its impacts. Local governments have led the way in mitigation and recovery efforts to best support the community and its needs. With over \$4 billion estimated in direct aid to Florida counties, the Recovery Funds were essential to support communities in both urban and rural areas across

the state struggling with the long-term effects of COVID-19 and unforeseen costs that will continue over the next few years.



Since 1999, over 500,000 Americans have died from an overdose involving opioids. More specifically, some 247,000 of these deaths involved prescription opioids. Between 1999-2019, deaths from prescription opioids more than quadrupled. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has estimated that the economic burden from prescription opioid misuse alone in the U.S. costs \$78.5 billion annually, including the costs of healthcare, lost productivity, addiction treatment and criminal justice. More than 2,800 lawsuits have been brought by government entities against opioid manufacturers, distributers, marketers, major national pharmacies, and physicians, including the state and about 100 local governments in Florida. These cases have been consolidated before U.S. District Court Judge Dan Polster, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, (i.e., National Prescription Opiate Litigation, MDL 2804; Case No. 1:17-md-02804-DAP). This program will provide an engaging discussion regarding the ongoing national opioid crisis, effects on our communities and county governments, and provide an update on litigation and settlement efforts, including the Florida Attorney General's proposed Memorandum of Understanding which establishesd an allocation methodology for distributing the funds Florida is likely to receive in settlement of pending claims.


Derreck Kayongo, Ugandan Refugee Turns Soap into Hope

Inspired by his experiences as a refugee in Kenya, and knowing that in-crisis communities are often without any soap at all, Derreck Kayongo and his wife Sarah formed Global Soap, a life-changing international aid organization that collected discarded soap from hotels, reprocessed it and distributed it to vulnerable populations worldwide.

In 2015, Global Soap joined forces with Clean the World, a global health leader in water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) and sustainability. Clean the World's foundation continues to develop programs to support children and their families in at-risk communities around the world and has contributed towards a 60% reduction in the death rate of

children under the age of 5 due to hygiene-related illnesses.

Though most well known as a 2011 CNN Hero and founder of the Global Soap Project, Kayongo is an expert in environmental sustainability and global health, as well as
