

- Prepare a Technical Memorandum summarizing the county responses




#### Schedule

- Extended to September 9, 2016 to accommodate delays due to storm response and summer BOCC schedules






# **DEP Project Categories**






## Stage of Development






### **Environmental Permits**

## **Summary Points**

- 7 counties submitted no projects and requested assistance in identifying priorities and developing projects
- 6 counties submitted partial project information and requested assistance in identifying priorities and developing projects
- 10 counties submitted substantially complete project information and most requested further consultation



## **Summary Points**

- 63 projects proposed by 16 counties
- Environmental projects outnumber economic projects 4 to 1
- Water Quality/Quantity projects account for >50% of total submitted
- 41% of submitted projects are "ideas or concepts"
- Total project cost = \$318,261,152
- Average project cost = \$5,051,764



## **Summary Points**

- Extrapolated total project count ~90
- Too many projects will substantially increase implementation grant administrative burden
- Fewer larger projects are preferable
- Refining priorities and consolidating multiple projects into "programs" will be needed
