






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HOME RULE ADVOCACY

- Prevented preemption of vacation rentals to the state that would thus prohibit a local law, ordinance, or regulation from allowing or requiring inspections or licensing of vacation rentals (SB 552)
- Defeated preemption that would have prevented local government from using public funds to retain a lobbyist to represent the local government before the legislative or executive branch (HB 215)
- Stopped preemption creating the "Occupational Regulation Sunset Act" that would have established a schedule for systematic review of the costs and benefits of occupational regulatory programs to determine whether to allow the program to expire, renew with/without modifications, or provide other action over a four-year period by the legislature (SB 344/HB 471)
- Supported legislation that renames the Southeast Florida Coral Reef Ecosystem Area to honor former Representative and Broward County Commissioner, Kristin Jacobs, who passed the original legislation that created the Southeast Florida Coral Reef Ecosystem Area from Martin County to Biscayne Bay (HB 217)
- Rallied behind a measure that adopted provisions from several broadband bills to create a multifaceted approach to tackling the Digital Divide in Florida, in turn addressing broadband and mapping improvements, establishing a "Opportunity Grant" program, and securing funding for broadband (HB 1239)
- Backed e-fairness legislation that applied Florida's sales and use tax to online/e-commerce sales from out of state retailers regardless of whether the entity has a physical presence within the state (SB 50)



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SAVING TAX DOLLARS WHILE PROVIDING VALUE ADDED RESOURCES TO FLORIDA'S COUNTIES



61 counties received competitive discount pricing on vehicles and equipment by partnering with the Florida Sheriffs Association.



Counties spent \$198,745,965.80 on vehicle and fire rescue contracts through FSA with a total of 2,584 total items purchased.



- 9 counties financed their infrastructure and capital needs through the Florida Local Government Finance Program (FLGFP), a flexible, low-interest, short- to medium-term loan program.
- Sarasota County took advantage of \$15.1 million for West Dearborn Street Improvements, Fire Station Roof Replacement, and refinancing.
- Charlotte County, Hardee County and the City of Kissimmee also used FLGFP in 2021 to refinance their loans - totaling \$23 million.
- Since program inception in 1991, FLGFC has lent over \$2.6 billion to 50+ Florida local governments.



- Retained 100% of FACT members at policy renewal and added Gulf County as a new FACT member.
- The 2021 FACT Risk Management Conference was held October 14, 2021, in St. Johns County, Florida. There were a total of 63 attendees pre-registered for the conference.
- The FACT quarterly risk management roundtables were held virtually to start the year in January 2021 and then in a hybrid setting for the remainder of 2021. These roundtables provide an interactive learning and risk management application model that has proven to be an effective and viable tool for all participants.



- Total Fund Balance as of 9/30/21: \$1,660,941,430
- Number of Florida Trust members as of 9/30/21: 107
- The Florida Trust is the longest running, member-owned and member-governed local government investment pool in Florida.
- The Florida Trust is designed to complement existing investment programs by providing investment vehicles for funds that can be invested in short- to intermediateterm securities and have returns generally greater than the national average for money market instruments.


