<u>PUBLIC ASSISTANCE</u> (Assistance for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities):

Brevard, Charlotte, Citrus, Clay, Collier, DeSoto, Duval, Flagler, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Hernando, Highlands, Hillsborough, Indian River, Lake, Lee, Manatee, Marion, Martin, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Putnam, Sarasota, Seminole, St. Johns, St. Lucie, Sumter, and Volusia Counties and the Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Florida for debris removal and emergency protective measures (Categories A and B), including direct federal assistance.

For a period of 90 days of the state's choosing within the first 120 days from the start of the incident period, FEMA is authorized to provide federal funding for debris removal and emergency protective measures (Categories A and B), including direct federal assistance, at 100 percent of the total eligible costs.

<u>HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM</u> (Assistance for actions taken to prevent or reduce long term risk to life and property from natural hazards):

All areas in the State of Florida are eligible to apply for assistance under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.
