

LAME DUCK SESSION: 118TH CONGRESS

Must happen:

- Government funding deadline December 20
- Farm Bill Reauthorization
- National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA)
- Water Resources Development Act (WRDA)
- Economic Development Agency (EDA)
 Reauthorization

Likely to happen:

- Disaster supplemental package \$98.6 billion request from White House
 - \$40 billion for FEMA Disaster Relief Fund
 - \$24 billion for USDA Emergency Programs
 - \$12 billion for HUD CDBG-DR
 - \$2 billion for SBA Disaster Loans







LOOKING AHEAD: 119TH CONGRESS & NEW ADMINISTRATION

119th CONGRESS: SENATE

· Republicans gain control of the Senate



*Two seats held by independents who caucus with Democrats

POST-ELECTION: 119th CONGRESS

218 seats is magic number for majority



What we know:

- Republicans control both chambers of Congress and the White House
- New Senate GOP leadership
- Budget reconciliation is likely
- 2018 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act needs reauthorization
- Must address any outstanding issues from 118th Congress, including government funding

What we are monitoring:

- New committee assignments
- Funding levels
- **Executive actions**
- Possibility for repealing previous administration policies
- Efforts to streamline federal programs and reduce red tape

Call to Action: Specific Steps




- Consult with county leaders and partners on priorities, policies and practices
- Dialogue with presidential transition teams and congressional leadership
- Review existing federal disaster assistance policies, programs and practices
- Review existing intergovernmental disaster policies and resources
- Explore effective intergovernmental collaboration
- Identify specific gaps and areas of improvement
- Evaluate public, private, nonprofit and philanthropic funding mechanisms
- Develop Final Report

NEW MEDICAID & CHIP REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUTH

REQUIRED IN ALL STATES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2025

- Starting in January 2025, states are required to use Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) to cover limited services for incarcerated youth who are soon to be released
- This applies to all Medicaid beneficiaries in custody following adjudication who are under age 21 or former foster youth under age 26
- The policy <u>requires</u> all states:
 - To provide screenings and diagnoses and service referrals for youth in 30 days before OR shortly after release
 - To provide case management in the 30 days before AND at least 30 days following release
- This applies to all state, local and tribal facilities where youth are incarcerated post-adjudication (prisons, jails, juvenile justice, and youth corrections)
- Additional **state option** to use Medicaid to cover comprehensive services for youth pending disposition of charges
