Legislative Wins for Florida Counties:

PASSED LEGISLATION

- Supported a clarification in statute authorizing counties to approve and oversee PACE providers within their jurisdiction
- Supported legislation removing matching requirements for certain rural economic development grant programs (HB 141)
- Supported legislation protecting sensitive public records of county attorneys (HB 103)
- Drafted and supported language allowing local building departments to use carryover funds for technology upgrades to streamline permit review (HB 267)

FAILED LEGISLATION

- Prevented legislation imposing term limits on County Commissioners (HB 57/SB 438)
- Stopped legislation raising the threshold for counties to increase the millage rate (HB 1195/SB 1322)
- Successfully removed language that would result in building permit applications being automatically "deemed approved" if permit review timelines are not met (HB 267)
- Defeated legislation that would preempt coastal building/zoning codes to DEP (HB 1079)

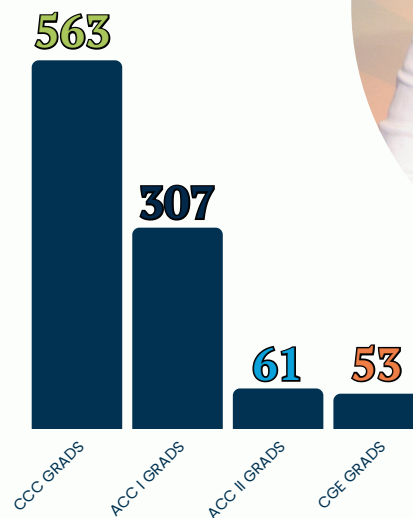

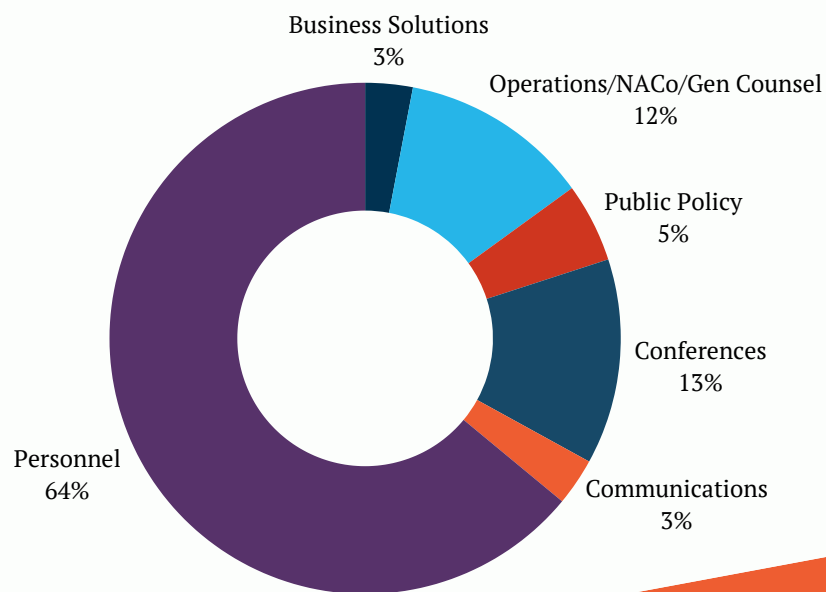
